As you read together, talk about:

What would you see if you were **outside** the box looking in?



Let's pretend we are hiding **inside** a box.

Describe the box that you see on the page.

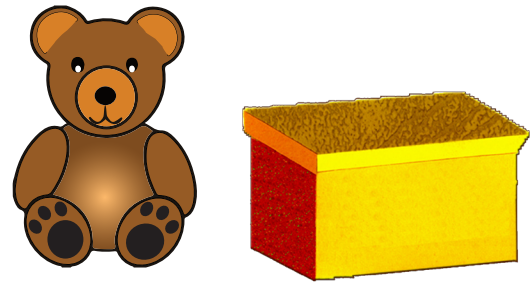
What would you do with a **big** box?

Talk about what fits **inside** when your child is helping you tidy up or when you have a big empty box.

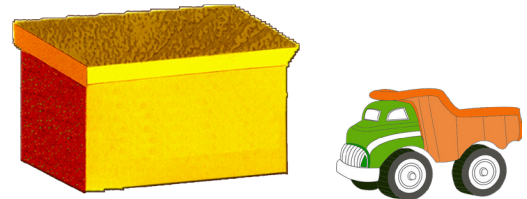
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Talk about what fits in boxes.

How do you know that your toy truck will fit **inside** the shoe box?



Your legs are **inside** the box. Your head and shoulders are **outside** the box!
