Make up patterns of words and actions together as you go about the day.

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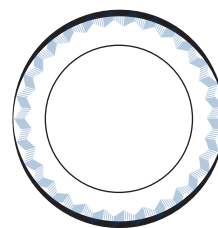
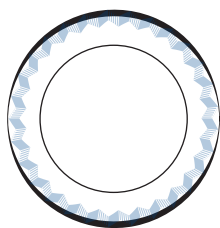
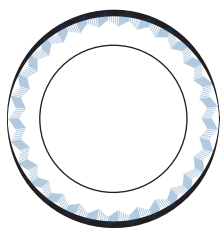
Talk about patterns in words and actions.
